The FMCS Chairman said the ILA and management averted a strike last year in October 2012 that could have crippled the nation's economy. Mr. Cohen praised the ILA and management for agreeing to a series of contract extensions that ultimately gave enough time to finalize a contract.

The two Obama Cabinet members, Secretary Pritzker and Secretary Perez, both highlighted the sacred right of Collective Bargaining Agreements and noted how these agreements help grow the nation's economy.
